## \$4 Wool Packs – Do you have yours?

As farmers, we saw the deteriorating state of the nations recycled wool packs and decided to invest in an industry-good opportunity that would provide an immediate financial benefit to you, our members.

We are now providing new wool packs at a cost of \$4 to members supplying wool to Elders Primary Wool. The value of this initiative, on top of the rebate and 10% dividend issues in March 2013 will amount to about \$16 per bale in the 2013 year.

Since we have started this initiative we have seen a significant increase in the number of new Cooperative shareholders. This is great news for all existing shareholders, and for the wool industry as every new member means more that can be spent on projects to lift demand for wool.

## **Wool Prices**

The last sale in July saw prices of almost all categories of crossbred wool continuing their upward trend despite the firming of the New Zealand dollar. This is a result of a shortage of wool on sale at present and buyers anticipating less wool being available later in the season. Additionally, there are buyers with contracts that were written some months ago at lower prices, now scrambling to fill them before the prices rise further.

A slow and steady price rise rather than a sharp spike is seen as manageable by users of our wool. Crossbred prices are almost \$1 / kg higher now than one year ago.
